What does "consecration" to a saint mean? "Consecrating" oneself refers to dedicating oneself and setting oneself apart for a special relationship with a saint(s). Above all, this means setting aside time to be with and talk with and learn more about and from the life of a particular saint. In other words, it's developing a friendship with a saint and recognizing that he/she can teach us many things and intercede to God (Father, Son, & Holy Spirit) on our behalf more effectively than we can alone, because he/she is holy and "higher" than us (because they are in heaven with God and the other saints). Bishop Guglielmone has consecrated our Diocese to St. Joseph this year, which means not just asking St. Joseph to look out and intercede for us, but demands us *going to Joseph* (cf. Genesis 41:55) in the ways just described.

Sacrament Workshops Over the Summer – It’s important for us to understand that the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Holy Communion, and Confirmation are not “magic,” but they also are not “carrots to be earned.” The deacon, priest, or bishop who performs them does not simply wave his hand around like a wand, and “poof,” it happens. Moreover, the Sacraments should not require the receiver to jump exhaustively through hoops like a tiger at the circus! As Summer approaches, we will begin our first Sacrament workshops based upon our community’s immediate needs. Since each of the workshops are *extensions of our family-based catechesis*, they will each last only 6-8 weeks. The “gateway” to these Sacrament workshops is participation in our family-based faith formation program that has multiple 5-week modules (doctrine x 2, prayer, fellowship, & service) on Sundays throughout the year. The purpose of the workshops will be to help parents/guardians *who need assistance* in their children’s preparation for the various Sacraments. Those parents who feel they can prepare their child by themselves at home should meet with Fr. David Nerbun, and they will be given a small list of things the child will need to know to receive the Sacrament (e.g., the Act of the Contrition, the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit, etc.). As we move forward as a community, let us never fall into the myth that faith formation ends with “graduation” at Confirmation.
