**Sacrament Workshops over the Summer** – It’s important for us to understand that the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Holy Communion and Confirmation are not “magic”, but they are also not “carrots to be earned”. The deacon, priest, or bishop who performs them does not simply wave his hand around like a wand, and “poof”, it happens. Moreover, the Sacraments should not require the receiver to jump exhaustively through hoops like a tiger at the circus! As Summer approaches, we will begin our first Sacrament workshops based upon our community’s immediate needs. Since each of the workshops are extensions of our *family-based catechesis*, they will each last only 6-8 weeks. The “gateway” to these Sacrament workshops is participation in our family-based faith formation program that has multiple workshops will be to help parents/guardians *who need* assistance in their children’s preparation for the various Sacraments. Those parents who feel they can prepare their child by themselves at home should meet with Fr. David Nerbun, and they will be given a small list of things the child will need to know to receive the Sacrament (e.g., the Act of the Contrition, the gifts, and fruits of the Holy Spirit, etc.). As we move forward as a community, let us never fall into the myth that faith formation ends with “graduation” at Confirmation. **What is a “quasi-parish” and how is it different than just a “parish?”** Many of you may be asking this question as the Bishop has expressed his intention and is moving forward with canonically (legally according to Church law) establishing the Catholic Community of Carolina Forest as a “quasi-parish.” Basically a quasi-parish has official boundaries, a pastor, and rights and responsibilities like any parish, but by only being “quasi”, the Bishop typically exempts it from certain responsibilities that will allow it to mature more rapidly and integrally in its “infancy.”

**What does the process of becoming a quasi-parish entail?** According to Canon Law, the Bishop must consult neighboring parishes that would be affected by its creation and present the proposal to the Presbyteral Council (comprised of various chosen and elected priests throughout the Diocese). Our Bishop has consulted the neighboring parishes of St. James and St. Andrews and is now preparing to present his plan to the Presbyteral Council in May. After that, he will use the various recommendations and feedback to solidify his plan.


Father Peyton spreads the message of "The family that prays together stays together." In a time when families are feeling torn apart, Father Peyton's simple but powerful message of family prayer brings hope and a way forward to restoration. Every family needs to watch this film.

This is an inspiring documentary about a poor, uneducated Irish immigrant who sets sail for America in 1928 with nothing but his faith and dreams of becoming a millionaire. Arriving in Pennsylvania and unable to find work, he accepts the position as a janitor at the cathedral, which rekindles his long-lost desire to become a priest and changes the course of his life.

Nearing ordination, his life takes a radical turn when he is stricken with tuberculosis. Facing certain death, he sinks into despair. A visit from his mentor, who delivers a simple message to pray, lifts the darkness. Taking his advice to heart, Patrick prays fervently to Mary, the Mother of Christ, for her intercession and he experiences a miraculous recovery. Feeling deep gratitude, he dedicates his life to telling all the world about the power of prayer and encourages families everywhere to bring prayer into their homes.

Never taking "No" for an answer, he convinces Hollywood's biggest stars to help him spread the message, "The family that prays together stays together", through the power of mass media including radio, television, and film. Father Peyton's fame spreads around the world and audiences in the millions flock to his public prayer rallies. This is the story of a tireless missionary, an unlikely hero, and one of history's greatest advocates for family prayer.
